Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 26 MRSA §597-A is enacted to read:

<u>§597-A.</u> Polygraph test as condition of employment

An employer or an agent of an employer may not require a prospective employee, as a condition of consideration for employment or as a condition of employment or promotion, to submit to a polygraph test. For the purposes of this section, "polygraph test" means the use of an instrument that as heartbeat, blood pressure and respiration, to detect possible deception during an interrogation.
