34	Except as provided in subsection 2, any department of this State or any of its political subdivisions, any county, city, town,
36	township or plantation may engage in construction of any public work involving professional engineering without procuring the
38	services of a registered professional engineer, as long as the contemplated expenditure for the completed project does not
40	exceed \$100,000 and the work, both as performed and as completed, does not create an undue risk to public safety or welfare.

	2. Exception. A department of this State may require the
44	services of a registered professional engineer for any public works project if the services of the professional engineer are
46	required to comply with any provision of law or rule.'

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## **SUMMARY**

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	This amendment replaces the bill. Current law provides that
б	state or local public works departments may undertake public
	works projects without engaging the services of a registered
8	professional engineer as long as the contemplated cost for the
	project does not exceed \$5,000. The amendment changes the law to
10	permit public works departments to undertake projects without
	engaging the services of a registered professional engineer,
L 2	provided the contemplated cost for the project does not exceed
	\$100,000 and the work does not create an undue risk to public
14	safety or welfare, or a State agency does not require the
	services of a registered professional engineer to meet any
<b>L</b> 6	provision of law or rule.
