COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "H" to H.P. 615, L.D. 840

Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the summary the following:

FISCAL NOTE

1997-98

APPROPRIATIONS/ALLOCATIONS

General Fund

\$11,259

This bill will require the revision of the minimum wage 14 poster by the Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Standards. A General Fund appropriation of \$11,259 in fiscal year 1997-98 is 16 required for printing and mailing costs. If other bills are enacted that also require changes to this poster, the cost 18 properly allocated to this bill can be reduced.

20 This bill may increase prosecutions for Class E crimes. If a jail sentence is imposed, the additional costs to the counties 22 are estimated to be \$83.78 per day per prisoner. These costs are not reimbursed by the State. The number of prosecutions that may 24 result in a jail sentence and the resulting costs to the county jail system are expected to be insignificant.

The additional workload and administrative costs associated with the minimal number of new cases filed in the court system can be absorbed within the budgeted resources of the Judicial Department. The collection of additional fines may increase General Fund revenue by minor amounts.

The additional costs associated with reviewing the Small 34 Business Job Protection Act of 1996 can be absorbed by the Department of Administrative and Financial Services utilizing 36 existing budgeted resources.'

SUMMARY

This amendment removes the provision in the original bill 42 that permits the payment of an opportunity wage of \$4.25 per hour to employees under the age of 20 for their first 90 days of 44 employment. The amendment also adds a fiscal note to the bill.
