An Act to Prohibit the Clerk of the House and the Secretary of the Senate from Participating in Political Activities while in Office.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
Sec. 1. 3 MRSA §21-B is enacted to read:
§21-B. Secretary of Semate; political activity prohibited
1. Political activity. A person who serves as Secretary of the Senate may not engage in political activity while the person is serving as Secretary of the Senate.
2. Penalty. A person who violates subsection 1 is ineligible to serve as Secretary of the Senate.
Sec. 2. 3 MRSA §41-B is enacted to read:
§41-B. Clerk of the House of Representatives; political activity prohibited
1. Political activity. A person who serves as Clerk of the House of Representatives may not engage in political activity while the person is serving as Clerk of the House of Representatives.
2. Penalty. A person who violates subsection 1 is ineligible to serve as Clerk of the House of Representatives.
SUMMARY
This bill prohibits the Clerk of the House of Representatives and the Secretary of the Senate from participating in political activities while in office.
