Provides funds for direct 6 awards to homeless shelters 8 in the State for the provision of mental health services to persons in need 10 of mental health services 12 staying in shelters. Funds must be awarded through a 14 competitive bidding process.

SUMMARY

This bill establishes the Mental Health Services in Homeless Shelters Fund to provide funding to homeless shelters in the 20 State for the provision of mental health services to persons in 22 need of those services staying in shelters. It appropriates \$2,000,000 to the fund in each year of this biennium, which must 24 be provided directly to shelters through a competitive bidding The bill requires the Department of Mental Health, process. Mental Retardation and Substance Abuse Services to oversee and 26 award bids upon the recommendation of the Interagency Task Force on Homelessness and Housing Opportunities. 28

30 The bill requires mental health workers in homeless shelters to consult with the department within 5 days of a person's 32 admission to a shelter to identify an appropriate residential and mental health placement for the person in need of mental health 34 services and to make the placement within a reasonable period of time.

The bill also requires the department to develop licensing standards for homeless shelters in consultation with the Maine Coalition for the Homeless and the Interagency Task Force on Homelessness and Housing Opportunities and to report to the Joint Standing Committee on Health and Human Services by October 1, 1997.

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
