The Department of Human Services, the Department of Mental Health, Mental Retardation and Substance Abuse Services, the Department of Education, the Department of Corrections and the Department of Public Safety will require significant additional General Fund appropriations to develop a single intake system. The cost of implementing this system, by department, by fund and by fiscal year, can not be determined at this time and will depend on the specific programmatic changes intended.

The additional costs associated with continuing the Department of Human Services' current efforts to develop a referral system can be absorbed by the department utilizing existing budgeted resources.'

This amendment replaces the bill. Ιt requires Department of Corrections, the Department of Education, Department of Human Services, the Department of Mental Health, and Substance Mental Retardation Abuse Services and Safety Department o£ Public to establish a coordinated information referral system and a single intake system for clients. By January 1, 1998, the named departments are required to report to the Joint Standing Committee on Health and Human Services regarding their progress in establishing the systems. The report must contain any legislation required to establish the systems.
