### Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 20-A MRSA §1005 is enacted to read:

#### §1005. Student member

Beginning in school year 1997-98, each school board must have a nonvoting member who is a secondary public school student. The student member is selected by the other elected members and must attend a public secondary school within the geographical jurisdiction of the school board. The term of the student member is coterminous with the school year.

14 Sec. 2. 30-A MRSA §2005 is enacted to read:

#### 16 **§2005.** Student member

18 Beginning December 1, 1998, the municipal officers shall select a student who resides in the municipality and attends a 20 public secondary school to serve as a nonvoting member on the municipal legislative body. The term of the student member is 22 coterminous with the school year.

Sec. 3. Secondary school students; state organizations. 24 The State Planning Office shall review all state organizations, including and commissions, to determine on which boards of those 26 organizations it is appropriate to include a secondary public school student as a nonvoting member and shall report 28 its findings, including any necessary implementing legislation to ensure appropriate placement of those student members, to the 30 Second Regular Session of the 118th Legislature by January 1, 1998. 32

#### SUMMARY

This bill seeks to involve the youth of the State in public 38 service. The bill requires school boards and municipal legislative bodies to select secondary school students to serve as nonvoting members on those bodies. 40 The bill further directs State Planning Office the to review state organizations, 42 including boards and commissions, to determine on which ones it would be appropriate to place student members.
