An Act to Permit the Joint Tribal Council of the Passamaquoddy Tribe to Change the Names of Geographical Locations within Passamaquoddy Territory.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 30 MRSA §6206, sub-§4 is enacted to read:

4. Names of geographic features within Passamaquoddy territory. The Joint Tribal Council of the Passamaquoddy Tribe may change the name of any geographic feature within Passamaquoddy territory from names that are offensive to appropriate prediscovery or original names. The Joint Tribal Council of the Passamaquoddy Tribe shall notify the Commissioner of Conservation, the Secretary of the United States Interior and other public agencies, boards, committees or other groups responsible for changing names of places and for ensuring that the name changes appear on maps and other public documents.

Sec. 2. Effective date. This Act does not take effect unless, within 60 days of adjournment of the First Regular Session of the 118th Legislature, the Secretary of State receives written notification by the Joint Tribal Council of the Passamaquoddy Tribe that the Passamaquoddy Tribe has agreed to the provisions of this Act pursuant to 25 United States Code, Section 1725(e)(1), copies of which must be submitted by the Secretary of State to the Secretary of the Senate and the Clerk of the House.

SUMMARY

This bill authorizes the Joint Tribal Council of the Passamaquoddy Tribe to change the names of geographic features such as lakes, hills, streams, ponds, etc., within Passamaquoddy territory from offensive names, usually assigned before the enactment of the Act to Implement the Maine Indian Claims Settlement, the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 30, chapter 601, to appropriate prediscovery or original names.
