SENATE AMENDMENT "B " to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 712, L.D. 976, Bill, "An Act to Amend the Enhanced 9-1-1 Laws"

Amend the amendment in section 3 in that part designated "~~§2930.~~" in subsection 1 in the first line (page 3, line 28 in amendment) by striking out the following: "~~1. Immunity.~~" and inserting in its place the following: '~~1. Governmental entity.~~'

Further amend the amendment in section 3 in that part designated "~~§2930.~~" by inserting after subsection 1 the following:

'2. Cellular or wireless telecommunications service provider. To the extent that a local exchange carrier is deemed to have limitations of liability and indemnification pursuant to the provisions of a tariff or schedule agreement in effect at the time of the transmission of the E-9-1-1 service, a cellular or wireless telecommunications provider that processes an E-9-1-1 communication has the same limitation of liability and indemnification that the local exchange carrier has for that E-9-1-1 transmission.'

SUMMARY


The bill, as amended by the committee amendment, requires cellular and wireless telecommunications service providers to be part of the state E-9-1-1 system. Traditional telephone service providers are already part of the E-9-1-1 system. This amendment limits liability and indemnification of a cellular or wireless telecommunications provider to the same extent that a local
