COMMITTEE AMENDMENT " \mathcal{H} " to H.P. 714, L.D. 978, Bill, "An Act to Improve the Efficiency of the Department of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources"

Amend the bill in section 1 in subsection 1 in the last line (page 1, line 16 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "for a period not to exceed 3 years" and inserting in its place the following: 'for a one-year, 2-year or 3-year period. <u>Registrations for a period in excess of one year may only be</u> issued with the agreement of or at the reguest of the applicant. <u>The fee for a 2-year registration is 2 times the annual fee.</u> The fee for a 3-year registration is 3 times the annual fee'

32 Further amend the bill in section 2 in the first paragraph in the 10th and 11th lines (page 1, lines 30 and 31 in L.D.) by 34 striking out the following: "for a period not to exceed 3 years" and inserting in its place the following: 'for a one-year, 36 2-year or 3-year period. Registrations for a period in excess of one year may only be issued with the agreement of or at the 38 request of the applicant. The fee for a 2-year registration is 2 times the annual fee. The fee for a 3-year registration is 3 40 times the annual fee'

42 Further amend the bill in section 3 in subsection 2 in the last 2 lines (page 2, lines 3 and 4 in L.D.) by striking out the
44 following: "for a period not to exceed 3 years" and inserting in its place the following: 'for a one-year, 2-year or 3-year
46 period. Licenses for a period in excess of one year may only be issued with the agreement of or at the request of the applicant.
48 The fee for a 2-year license is 2 times the annual fee. The fee for a 3-year license is 3 times the annual fee'

Further amend the bill in section 4 in that part designated "§2222." in the first paragraph in the last 2 lines (page 2, lines 15 and 16 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "for a period not to exceed 3 years" and inserting in its place the following: 'for a one-year, 2-year or 3-year period. Licenses for a period in excess of one year may only be issued with the agreement of or at the request of the applicant. The fee for a 2-year license is 2 times the annual fee. The fee for a 3-year license is 3 times the annual fee'

Further amend the bill by striking out all of section 5.

Further amend the bill in section 6 in subsection 1 in the 14 last line (page 2, line 40 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "for a period not to exceed 3 years" and inserting in 16 its place the following: 'for a one-year, 2-year or 3-year period. Registrations for a period in excess of one year may 18 only be issued with the agreement of or at the reguest of the applicant. The fee for a 2-year registration is 2 times the 20 annual fee. The fee for a 3-year registration is 3 times the annual fee'

Further amend the bill in section 7 in that part designated "§2501." in the first paragraph in the last 2 lines (page 3, lines 17 and 18 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "for a period not to exceed 3 years" and inserting in its place the following: 'for a one-year, 2-year or 3-year period. Licenses for a period in excess of one year may only be issued with the agreement of or at the request of the applicant. The fee for a 30 2-year license is 2 times the annual fee. The fee for a 3-year license is 3 times the annual fee'

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Further amend the bill in section 8 in that part designated 34 "**§2651.**" in the first paragraph in the last line (page 3, line 34 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "for a period not to 36 <u>exceed 3 years</u>" and inserting in its place the following: 'for a one-year, 2-year or 3-year period. Registrations for a period in 38 <u>excess of one year may only be issued with the agreement of or at</u> the request of the applicant. The fee for a 2-year registration 40 <u>is 2 times the annual fee. The fee for a 3-year registration is</u> 3 times the annual fee'

Further amend the bill in section 10 in subsection 2 in the 44 5th line (page 4, line 14 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "for a period not to exceed 3 years" and inserting in 46 its place the following: 'for a one-year, 2-year or 3-year period. Licenses for a period in excess of one year may only be 48 issued with the agreement of or at the request of the applicant. The fee for a 2-year license is 2 times the annual fee. The fee 50 for a 3-year license is 3 times the annual fee'

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Further amend the bill by striking out all of section 11 and inserting in its place the following:

'Sec. 11. 22 MRSA §2168, sub-§§1 and 2, as enacted by PL 1989, c. 888, §7, are amended to read:

- 8 1. Application and renewal. Each application for, or renewal of, a license to operate a food establishment must be accompanied by a fee, based on the number of employees as follows:
 - A. For 0 to 10 employees, \$10 <u>annually</u>;
- 14 B. For 11 to 25 employees, \$30 annually; and

16 C. For 26 or more employees, \$100 <u>annually</u>.

 A license may be issued for a one-year, 2-year or 3-year period. Licenses for a period in excess of one year may only be issued
 with the agreement of or at the request of the applicant. The fee for a 2-year license is 2 times the annual fee. The fee for
 a 3-year license is 3 times the annual fee.

24 2. Food salvage. Each application for, or renewal of, a license to operate a food salvage establishment or to act as a salvage broker must be accompanied by a fee, not to exceed \$30 annually, determined by the commissioner. A license may be issued for a one-year, 2-year or 3-year period. Licenses for a period in excess of one year may only be issued with the agreement of or at the request of the applicant. The fee for a 2-year license is 2 times the annual fee. '

34 Further amend the bill in section 12 in the first paragraph in the 2nd line (page 4, line 37 in L.D.) by striking out the 36 following: "a period not to exceed 3 years" and inserting in its place the following: 'a one-year, 2-year or 3-year period. 38 Licenses for a period in excess of one year may only be issued with the agreement of or at the request of the applicant. The 40 fee for a 2-year license is 2 times the annual fee. The fee for a 3-year license is 3 times the annual fee'

Further amend the bill in section 13 in the first paragraph
in the last 2 lines (page 5, lines 7 and 8 in L.D.) by striking
out the following: "for a period not to exceed 3 years" and
inserting in its place the following: 'for a one-year, 2-year or
3-year period. Licenses for a period in excess of one year may
only be issued with the agreement of or at the request of the
applicant. The fee for a 2-year license is 2 times the annual
fee. The fee for a 3-year license is 3 times the annual fee'

Further amend the bill by inserting after section 13 the following:

'Sec. 14. Report on multi-year licensing. No later than February 15, 2000, the Commissioner of Agriculture, Food and Rural 6 Resources shall report to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over agricultural matters on the 8 issuance of multi-year licenses and registrations. The report must provide information specific to each license or registration 10 authorized for multi-year issuance in this Act, including the number of licenses and registrations issued for one-year, 2-year 12 and 3-year periods. The report must also offer an assessment of efficiencies realized or difficulties encountered in implementing 14 the multi-year licenses and registrations.'

Further amend the bill by relettering or renumbering any 18 nonconsecutive Part letter or section number to read consecutively.

Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the summary the following:

'FISCAL NOTE

If applicants for certain licenses and registrations request 28 licensure or registration for up to a 3-year period from the Department of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources the collection of General Fund and dedicated revenue will shift 30 between fiscal years, possibly increasing revenue in the first year of implementation but decreasing it in the following 2 32 years. Over any 3-year period, the net difference in total revenues collected over the period is not expected to be 34 significant.

The department may also realize some minor administrative 38 savings from lower license and registration processing costs.'

SUMMARY

This amendment prohibits the Department of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources from requiring that licenses be issued for a period of 3 years. An applicant would have to agree to or request issuance for more than one year. It clarifies that the fee for multi-year licenses and registrations is based on the annual fee. It also requires the Commissioner of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources to report back to the Legislature by

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February 15, 2000 on the transition to multi-year licenses. It also adds a fiscal note to the bill.

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
