An Act to Encourage Organ Donation by Establishing an Organ Donation Registry.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 29-A MRSA §1402-A, sub-§§3 to 5 are enacted to read:

3. Choice to be included on registry. The Secretary of
State shall provide to a licensee who makes an anatomical gift pursuant to Title 22, chapter 710 a form that includes the
following question: "Do you want your name placed on a registry of potential organ or tissue donors?" The form must provide a
place for the licensee to indicate an answer of "Yes" or "Choose not to make a choice at this time."

4. Executing an anatomical gift. The Secretary of State
 14 shall by rule establish a procedure for a person to make an anatomical gift pursuant to Title 22, chapter 710 at the time of
 16 initially obtaining or renewing a license. Rules adopted pursuant to this subsection are major substantive rules under
 18 Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter II-A.

 20 5. Information on making an anatomical gift. The Secretary of State shall annually by mail make available to license holders
 22 information on organ and tissue donation. The Secretary of State shall also make information on organ and tissue donation
 24 available at Bureau of Motor Vehicles offices.

1. Registry established. The Secretary of State shall by rule establish and administer a registry of anatomical gifts that lists every person who makes an anatomical gift pursuant to Title 22, chapter 710 and who indicates a preference under section 1402-A, subsection 3 to be included in the registry. Rules adopted pursuant to this section are major substantive rules under Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter II-A.

2. Access by certain organizations. The rules established under subsection 1 must provide for access to the registry by a recognized organ procurement organization. The rules must define "recognized organ procurement organization" and establish a process by which such an organization may access the registry.

SUMMARY

This bill establishes a registry to voluntarily list holders of Maine driver's licenses who formally declare their choice to make an anatomical gift upon death. The bill also requires the Secretary of State to provide licensees at the time of initial
application or renewal with the information necessary to formally declare a person's choice to make an anatomical gift upon death.
The bill also requires the Secretary of State to make available to license holders information regarding organ and tissue donation.
