	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

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10	§14551. Definitions
12	As used in this chapter, unless the context otherwise indicates, the following terms have the following meanings.
14	1. Commissioner. "Commissioner" means the Commissioner of Professional and Financial Regulation.
16	2. Construction contract. "Construction contract" means an
18	agreement, whether written or oral, to perform work on real property.
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	3. Contractor. "Contractor" means a person or entity that
22	enters into a construction contract.
24	4. Department. "Department" means the Department of Professional and Financial Regulation, Division of Licensing and
26	Enforcement.
28	5. Real property. "Real property" means real estate, including lands, leaseholds, tenements and hereditaments and
30	improvements placed on real estate.
32	6. Work. "Work" means to build, alter, repair or demolish any improvement on, connected with or beneath the surface of any
34	real property and includes nonstructural work such as plumbing, heating and electrical work, laying carpeting and other
36	nonstructural work; or to excavate, clear, grade, fill or
38	landscape any real property; to construct driveways, private roadways, highways and bridges, drilled wells, septic systems, sewage systems or utilities; or to perform labor upon real
40	property. "Work" also includes any design or other professional or skilled services by persons such as, but not limited to,
42	architects, engineers, land surveyors, landscape architects and construction engineers.
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	§14552. Establishment of register
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48	The commissioner shall establish and maintain within the department a register of all contractors doing business in the State. The register is a matter of public record available for
50	public view in the officer of the department or on request at a

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fee sufficient to cover the cost of providing the information requested.

4 §14553. Registration requirements

- 6 <u>1. Forms: information required.</u> The commissioner shall adopt forms for contractor registration that require, at a 8 minimum, the following information:
- 10 <u>A. Name, address, telephone number and any other</u> communication access numbers;
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communication access numbers;

- B. A statement detailing the contractor's experience in the 14 trade:
- 16 <u>C. Proof of workers' compensation insurance; and</u>
- 18 D. Proof of liability insurance.

 20 2. Fees. Each person registering under this section shall pay an annual registration or renewal fee established by the
22 department by rule at a level sufficient to cover the costs of administering this chapter.

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<u>§14554. Information provided to applicants</u>

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When a contractor requests a registration form, the28department shall provide the contractor with an information
packet that includes clear information that sets out all30requirements under state law with which the contractor must
comply, including licensing requirements, tax liabilities,32insurance coverage, labor laws, consumer and contract
requirements and professional codes of ethics or conduct.

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<u>§14555. Renewals; updates</u>

Contractors must renew the registration annually, at which 38 time the contractors must be provided with applicable updates or amendments to the information provided under section 14554.

<u>§14556. Coordination with licensing boards</u>

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The department shall coordinate registration under this 44 chapter with any other licensing or certification requirements applicable to a contractor specific to the contractor's trade or 46 profession to promote efficiency and avoid duplication or unnecessary effort by the registrants.

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§14557. Registration not allowed

A person whose general or specific trade license, 4 certification or registration is revoked or suspended in this 5 State or another state may not register to do business in this 6 State unless the period of revocation or suspension is completed and the applicable state licensing or certification authority has 8 conducted a review and determined that the contractor meets all 10 legal and professional competency requirements to do business as 10 a contractor in this State.

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SUMMARY

This bill establishes in the Department of Professional and Financial Regulation, Division of Licensing and Enforcement, a comprehensive register of contractors doing business in the State. The information will be available to the public.

20 The bill specifies information that the contractor must provide and information that the department must provide the 22 registrants to ensure that they are aware of all applicable legal and ethical requirements for engaging in their particular 24 business in Maine.

26 The registrants must renew their registration annually and pay registration fees established by the department to cover the 28 costs of administration of this law, but these requirements must be coordinated with any specific licensing or certification 30 requirements with which the contractor must comply.

32 Registration is not permitted for a contractor whose license, certification or registration has been suspended or 34 revoked in this State or any other state unless the contractor passes a professional review.

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
