Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. Permit not required. A permit issued by the Department of Environmental Protection pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 38, chapter 3, subchapter I, Article 5-A is not required for removing or displacing vegetation in or on Number One Pond in Sanford provided that the activities are performed under the supervision of the Department of Environmental Protection.
