4 **Sec. 1. 34-A MRSA §7002, sub-§1, ¶¶D and E,** as enacted by PL
1983, c. 459, §6, are amended to read:

6 D. Working with other public and voluntary agencies as
resources for the purchase of care and services; and

8 E. Stimulating the creation of voluntary services, ; and

10 **Sec. 2. 34-A MRSA §7002, sub-§1, ¶F** is enacted to read:

12 F. Providing academic and social programs to discuss
14 methods of crime prevention and conflict resolution with the
16 community, schools and school boards.

20 This bill requires the Department of Education to provide
academic and social programs to juvenile offenders to give them
22 the opportunity to discuss methods of crime prevention and
conflict resolution with community members and school personnel.
