An Act to Prohibit Persons Registering to Vote from Voting unless they Provide Adequate Identification.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 21-A MRSA §121, sub-§1-A, as repealed and replaced by PL 1993, c. 695, §5, is amended to read:

6 1-A. Identification and proof. Registration applications taken by outside agencies must be transferred to the Secretary of 8 State within 5 days of receipt. An applicant who attempts to register within 20 days of an election must be advised that the 10 registrar might not receive the application before that election, but that the applicant may register in person on election day.

Registration applications received by the Secretary of State from outside agencies 21 days or more before an election must be 14 transferred to the appropriate registrar's office within 10 days of receipt. Registration applications received by the Secretary 16 of State from outside agencies 20 days or less before an election must be transferred to the appropriate registrar's office within 18 5 days of receipt. Registration applications by mail must be 20 received in the registrar's office by the close of business 15 days before election day in order for persons to appear on the 22 list of registered voters for that election.

 A person who registers during the 15 days before election day or on election day shall register in person and show proof of identity and residency. If The person may not vote until satisfactory proof of identity and-residency-can-net-be is provided to the registrar or deputyr--the-person-casts--a ehallenged-ballet. For purposes of this subsection:

A. Proof of identity includes, but is not limited to, a
32 Maine driver's license, state identification card, school identification card or social security card; and

B. Proof of residency includes, but is not limited to, any one of the items listed in paragraph A that has on it the person's current address or any of the items in paragraph A along with an envelope showing the name and address of the person as the recipient.

SUMMARY

Current law requires a person who registers to vote within 15 days of election day to provide satisfactory proof of identity and residency; a person who fails to do so casts a challenged ballot.

50 This bill requires a person who registers within 15 days of election day, including those registering on election day, to

provide proof of identity, such as a Maine driver's license, state identification card, school identification card or social security card and proof of residency, such as an envelope addressed to the person. The person may not vote until the person provides satisfactory proof of identity.
