HOUSE AMENDMENT "B" to SENATE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 777, L.D. 1065, Bill, "An Act to Require Law Enforcement Officers to Inform a Person Who Fails to Submit to a Blood Test about the Informed Consent Law"

Amend the amendment by inserting after the title the following:

'Amend the bill by striking out the title and substituting the following:

'An Act to Require Law Enforcement Officers to Inform a Person Who Fails to Submit to a Test about the Informed Consent Law'

Further amend the amendment in the first indented paragraph after the title in the first line (page 1, line 19 in amendment) by striking out the following: "Amend" and inserting in its place the following: 'Further amend'

Further amend the amendment in subsection 3 in the 3rd line (page 1, line 25 in amendment) by striking out the following: "blood"

Further amend the amendment in subsection 3 in the last line (page 1, line 28 in amendment) by striking out the following: "may" and inserting in its place the following: 'will'
