An Act to Transfer a Certain Parcel of Land from the Department of Conservation to the Department of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. Transfer of parcel of land. The Department of Conservation shall transfer to the Department of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources for no fee for the benefit of the Waldo County Soil and Water Conservation District a certain lot or parcel of land, situated in the Town of Waldo, in the County of Waldo, bounded and described as follows:

Beginning at the intersection of Routes 137 and 131 and proceeding northeasterly along the southern line of Route 131, 360 feet to a stone wall; thence southeasterly along the stone wall 130 feet; thence southwesterly along a stone wall 335 feet to the northern line of Route 137; thence northwesterly along the northern line of Route 137, 220 feet to the point of beginning, containing approximately 1.4 acres; being the premises conveyed to the State of Maine Forestry Department by Merton and Abbie Gardiner by their deed June 21, 1995 recorded in the Waldo County Registry of Deeds in Book 526, page 131.

SUMMARY

This bill requires the Department of Conservation to transfer to the Department of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources a certain parcel of land in the Town of Waldo for the benefit of the Waldo County Soil and Water Conservation District.
