

2 **Emergency preamble.** Whereas, Acts and resolves of the
Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after
adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

6 **Whereas,** the Maine Administrative Procedure Act, Title 5,
chapter 375, subchapter II-A, requires legislative authorization
before major substantive agency rules may be finally adopted by
8 the agency; and

10 **Whereas,** the above named major substantive rule has been
submitted to the Legislature for review; and

14 **Whereas,** immediate enactment of this resolve is necessary to
record the Legislature's position on final adoption of the rule;
and

18 **Whereas,** in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts
create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of
Maine and require the following legislation as immediately
20 necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and
safety; now, therefore, be it

24 **Sec. 1. Adoption. Resolved:** That final adoption of Chapter
374, Rules Regarding the Traffic Movement Standard of the Site
Location of Development Law, a provisionally adopted major
26 substantive rule of the Department of Environmental Protection,
Bureau of Land and Water Quality, and submitted to the
28 Legislature for review pursuant to the Maine Administrative
Procedure Act, is authorized.

32 **Emergency clause.** In view of the emergency cited in the
preamble, this resolve takes effect when approved.
