SENATE AMENDMENT "U" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 832, L.D. 1137, Bill, "An Act Making Unified Appropriations and Allocations for the Expenditures of State Government, General Fund and Other Funds, and Changing Certain Provisions of the Law Necessary to the Proper Operations of State Government for the Fiscal Years Ending June 30, 1998 and June 30, 1999"

Amend the amendment in Part S in section 2 in the first line (page 257, line 35 in amendment) by striking out the following: "**Transportation**" and inserting in its place the following: '**Education**'

Further amend the amendment in Part S in section 2 in the 6th line (page 257, line 40 in amendment) by striking out the following: "Transportation to be applied towards the purchase of Sears Island" and inserting in its place the following: 'Education to be applied towards out-of-district placements for special education'

**FISCAL NOTE**


This amendment will have no net effect on General Fund appropriations and revenue and a balanced budget is maintained for fiscal year 1997-98 and fiscal year 1998-99.
