An Act to Meet Maine National Guard Payrolls Related to the Ice Storms of 1998.

(EMERGENCY)

Reported by Representative KERR for the Joint Standing Committee on Appropriations and Financial Affairs pursuant to Joint Order H.P. 148.

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4 Whereas, the State of Maine has been declared to be a Federal Disaster Area as a result of at least one ice storm, 6 which has resulted in massive power outages and significant damages to individuals, businesses and communities throughout 8 most of the State; and 10 Whereas, the State of Maine has been impacted by additional 12 storms in 1998 as well; and 14 Whereas, these natural disasters have had a serious adverse impact on the State, which has required the important services of the Maine National Guard; and 16 Whereas, upcoming Maine National Guard payrolls can not be 18 met without additional funding; and 20 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of 22 Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and 24 safety; now, therefore, 26 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows: 28 Sec. 1. 5 MRSA §1513, sub-§1-H is enacted to read: 30 1-H. Transfer from the Maine Rainy Day Fund; Maine National Guard payrolls in fiscal year 1997-98. Notwithstanding 32 subsection 2 and section 1585, an amount not to exceed \$785,000 34 in fiscal year 1997-98 must be transferred from the available balance in the Maine Rainy Day Fund to the "Military Training and 36 Operations" General Fund program in the Department of Defense, Veterans and Emergency Management to be made available by 38 financial order, upon the recommendation of the State Budget Officer and approval of the Governor, to be used to meet Maine 40 National Guard payrolls in fiscal year 1997-98. Sec. 2. Repayment to Maine Rainy Day Fund. All funds received 42 by the State as reimbursement from the Federal Government for its share of the Maine National Guard payrolls referenced in section 44 1 of this Act must be deposited in the Maine Rainy Day Fund as

FISCAL NOTE

The bill authorizes the transfer of up to \$785, Maine Rainy Day Fund in fiscal year 1997-98 to the D Defense, Veterans and Emergency Management to meet Ma Guard payrolls. 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The bill provides for a transfer from the Maine Rainy Day Fund of \$785,000 to meet Maine National Guard payrolls in fiscal year 1997-98 related to the recent ice storms. All amounts reimbursed from the Federal Government would be deposited in the Maine Rainy Day Fund as soon as practicable.
