24	Amend the resolve by striking out all of section 1 and inserting in its place the following:
26	See 1 Adoption with amandment Desalved.
28	'Sec. 1. Adoption with amendment. Resolved: The final adoption of Chapter 302: Consumer Education Program; Electric Restructuring, a provisionally adopted major substantive rule of
30	the Public Utilities Commission and submitted to the Legislature for review pursuant to the Maine Administrative Procedure Act, is
32	authorized, but only if the rule is amended as follows:
34	1. Section 5, paragraph B is amended by striking the last sentence and new language is inserted providing that the
36	commission must consider the recommendations of the advisory
38	board in developing and implementing the consumer education plan
30	and program; and
40	2. Section 6, paragraph B is amended by inserting the word "only" after the phrase "for informational purposes."

16	resolve, is \$200,000 in fiscal year 1997-98 and \$600,000 in fiscal year 1998-99. The additional dedicated revenue is capped

22	additional expenditures that the commission will need to make to establish the consumer education program. A legislative

28	SUMMARY
30	This amendment authorizes the Public Utilities Commission to finally adopt its standard offer rule, provided the rule is
32	amended to provide that the commission must consider the recommendations of the advisory board in developing and
34	implementing the consumer education program. It also adds a fiscal note to the resolve.
