38	SUMMARY
40	This bill requires nonprofit hospital and medical service
42	organizations, insurance companies and health maintenance organizations providing health coverage in this State to provide
44	the names, addresses, social security numbers, dates of birth and time periods of eligibility for coverage of all persons receiving
46	health coverage to the Department of Human Services upon request. This information will allow the department to determine
48	whether recipients of Medicaid benefits are concurrently eligible for private coverage from a nonprofit hospital and medical
50	service organization, insurance company or health maintenance organization.
