4	§313-B. Testifying before a legislative committee;

8	Prior to testifying before a committee of the Legislature, a person registered to lobby shall disclose if that person is being
10	compensated by a member of that committee either directly or
	indirectly through payment of dues by the committee member to a
12	union, association, political action committee or organization
	that provides compensation to the person testifying in exchange
14	for lobbying services.
