Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 32 MRSA §1451, first ¶, as amended by PL 1993, c. 600,
4 Pt. A, §105, is further amended to read:

The State Board of Funeral Service, as established by Title
5, section 12004-A, subsection 18, and in this chapter called the
8 "board," consists of ~~8~~ 9 members, one of whom must represent
10 the interests of senior citizens, 6 of whom must be persons
licensed for the practice of funeral service for 10 consecutive
12 years or who have had 10 consecutive years' experience as a
practitioner of funeral service in this State immediately
14 preceding their appointment and 2 of whom must be representatives
of the public. Members are appointed by the Governor for a term
of 4 years. The member representing the interests of senior
16 citizens must be selected from a list of applicants provided by a
national organization of retired persons. Appointments of
18 members must comply with section 60. A board member may be
removed by the Governor for cause.

This bill increases the membership of the State Board of
Funeral Service by adding a member representing the interests of
26 senior citizens and chosen from a list provided by a national
organization of retired persons such as the American Association
28 of Retired Persons.
