Preamble. Whereas, significant guantities of pharmaceuticals are used in the treatment of geriatric residents in long-term 2 care settings; and

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Whereas, it is important to the residents and to the State that pharmaceuticals are used properly and economically; and

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Whereas, guidelines for the use of pharmaceuticals for and service patients can assist administrators geriatric providers in making decisions about pharmaceuticals for that 10 population; now, therefore, be it

- Sec. 1. Study group to develop and recommend guidelines for use of 14 pharmaceuticals. Resolved: That the Department of Human Services shall form a study group to develop and recommend guidelines for the use of pharmaceuticals to treat geriatric patients. 16 The study group must include physicians, medical directors, 18 administrators, nurses and consultant pharmacists who practice in long-term care facilities. The purpose of the guidelines is to enhance the ability of health care practitioners to provide 20 appropriate drug therapy in the most cost-effective manner. The 22 study group shall review existing pharmaceutical care guidelines in other states and Canada in formulating the guidelines; and be 24 it further
- 26 Sec. 2. Department of Human Services to provide staffing. **Resolved:** That the Department of Human Services shall provide 28 staff assistance to the study group. The study group may meet as often as it considers necessary to perform its duties. The study group shall solicit input from interested parties; and be it 30 further

Sec. 3. Guidelines to be developed by March 1, 2000. Resolved: 34 That the study group shall develop the guidelines by March 1, 2000 and shall present a copy of the guidelines to the Joint 36 Standing Committee on Health and Human Services. The study group shall also disseminate and encourage use of the guidelines to administrators and service providers who work with geriatric 38 patients.
