## 'FISCAL NOTE

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This bill may decrease the number of civil violations filed in the court system. The Judicial Department may realize some minor savings from reductions of workload and administrative costs associated with the minimal number of cases that will no longer be filed. Reductions in the collection of fines may decrease General Fund revenue by minor amounts.

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The Bureau of Insurance within the Department of Professional and Financial Regulation will incur some minor additional costs to revise its rules. These costs can be absorbed within the bureau's existing budgeted resources.'

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SUMMARY

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This amendment allows a health care practitioner to refer patients to another health care practitioner in a group practice or health care facility in which the referring health care practitioner has invested when there is a demonstrated need for the facility in the community. The amendment specifies that demonstrated need for the facility exists when the quality of health care services in the community would be improved, such as when the facility provides new specialty or subspecialty services.

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The amendment also adds a fiscal note to the bill.

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
