COMMITTEE AMENDMENT " A " to S.P. 824, L.D. 2227, Bill, "An Act to Expand Membership on the Maine Tourism Commission"

Amend the bill in section 1 in subsection 1 in paragraph C in subparagraph (6) in the last line (page 1, line 48 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "and"

Further amend the bill in section 1 in subsection 1 in paragraph C in subparagraph (7) in the last line (page 1, line 51 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "and" and inserting in its place the following: '; and'

Further amend the bill in section 1 in subsection 1 in paragraph C by inserting after subparagraph (7) the following:

'(8) At least one member representing a statewide organization of children's camps.'

Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the summary the following:

**FISCAL NOTE**

The Department of Economic and Community Development will incur some minor additional costs to pay the expenses of the four new members of the Maine Tourism Commission. These costs can be absorbed within the department's existing budgeted resources.'
