SUMMARY

This amendment requires that, by December 1, 2000, the Department of Environmental Protection, Board of Environmental Protection evaluate the feasibility of the State's zero-emission vehicle mandate in existence on March 1, 2000. The amendment specifies that, following the evaluation, any rule adopted by the board that contains a zero-emission vehicle mandate is a major substantive rule.
