Amend the bill by inserting after the enacting clause the following:
'Sec. 1. Funds revert to General Fund. Funds appropriated pursuant to this Act to the Maine Experimental Program to
Stimulate Competitive Research, or Maine EPSCoR Program, created in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 13124-B, reverse
to the General Fund if the program does not receive the anticipated federal energy research and development award.'
Further amend the bill by relettering or renumbering any
nonconsecutive Part letter or section number to reacconsecutively.
Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the summary the following:

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 882, L.D. 2297

This bill includes a General Fund appropriation of \$750,000
in fiscal year 2000-01 for the Maine Science and Technology
Foundation to provide matching funds for a federal grant for the
Maine Experimental Program to Stimulate Competitive Research
(EPSCoR) that is anticipated to be received in May 2000. The
estimated future costs will be approximately \$750,000 in each of
fiscal years 2001-02 and 2002-03 if the anticipated federal grant
is awarded

Requiring that these funds revert to the General Fund, if the federal grant is not awarded, will increase the amounts that lapse to General Fund unappropriated surplus at the end of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2001 by \$750,000.

This amendment provides that funds appropriated to match an anticipated federal award for the Maine EPSCoR Program revert to the General Fund if the anticipated federal award is not received. This amendment also adds a fiscal note to the bill.
