COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 883, L.D. 2298, Bill, "An Act to Clarify the Law Relating to the Renewal of Liquor Licenses"

Amend the bill in section 1 in paragraph C in the 5th and 6th lines (page 1, lines 10 and 11 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "in a case in which the existing license is not extended pending renewal"

Further amend the bill in section 1 in paragraph C in the last line (page 1, line 20 in L.D.) by inserting after the following: "paragraph." the following: 'This paragraph applies to an existing on-premise license that has been extended pending renewal. The municipal officers or the county commissioners shall take final action on an on-premise license that has been extended pending renewal within 120 days of the filing of the application.'

SUMMARY

This amendment clarifies the proposed language stating that the 60-day automatic renewal does not apply to on-premise licenses that are extended pending renewal. It also states that municipal officers or county commissioners must make a final decision on the renewal within 120 days.
