Sec. 1. Audit of Child Development Services System. Resolved: That the Department of Education shall contract with an 2 independent entity to conduct an audit of the Child Development Services System, referred to in this section as "CDS," as 4 established in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 20-A, section 7724. The audit must include an assessment of the following and 6 a determination of compliance with existing laws, rules and 8 regulations: 10 The impact of changes made at CDS sites on the 1. availability of the current provider network to serve children; 12 2. The cost effectiveness of direct CDS hires compared to costs of services from contract agencies, including all costs 14 associated with delivery of services, such as overhead, space, 16 support staff, equipment and supplies and staff development; 18 3. determination of payment source for children The receiving services from CDS sites compared to payment source for 20 children referred to contract agencies; 22 The availability of the contract agencies on the 4. effective date of this resolve and at the time CDS sites employed their own therapy staff; 24 26 The adequacy of the physical facilities at CDS sites 5. compared to contract agencies for providing the specialty 28 treatments needed for this population; 30 The use of case loads and productivity for direct hire 6. CDS staff as a basis for determining actual cost of services; 32 7. The qualifications of direct hire staff and supervision 34 of assistants as required by licensure regulations; The adequacy of documentation and compliance with 36 8. Medicaid policy by direct hires compared to contract agencies; and 38 9. The impact of CDS sites hiring their own staff on the 40 small businesses previously providing services; and be it further Sec. 2. Copies of audit provided to legislative committee. Resolved: 42 That the Department of Education shall provide copies of the 44 audit prepared pursuant to section 1 to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over education matters by December 1, 2000. 46 48

## SUMMARY

This bill directs the Department of Education to contract 4 with an independent entity to conduct an audit of the Child Development Services System and to assess its compliance with 6 existing laws and rules.

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
