An Act to Raise the Minimum Age to Buy Tobacco Products to 21 Years of Age.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows: 2 Sec. 1. 22 MRSA §1553-A, sub-§1, ¶¶B and C, as enacted by PL 1995, c. 470, §9 and affected by §19, are amended to read: 4 A sign must be affixed conspicuously to the front of the 6 в. machine. The sign must: 8 Contain lettering that is at least 3/8 inches in (1)height; and 10 12 (2) State the following: "WARNING. It is unlawful for any person under the age of 18 21 to purchase 14 cigarettes in this State." At all times during the hours the vending machine is 16 с. accessible, it must be located within the unobstructed line of sight and under the direct supervision of an adult. 18 That adult is responsible for preventing persons under 18 21 years of age from purchasing cigarettes or any other tobacco 20 product from that vending machine. 22 Sec. 2. 22 MRSA §1555-B, sub-§§1, 2 and 4, as enacted by PL 1997, c. 305, \$5, are amended to read: 24 Tobacco products may be sold at retail 26 1. Retail sales. only in a direct, face-to-face exchange in which the purchaser 28 may be clearly identified and through the mail under procedures approved by the department to provide reliable verification that 30 the purchaser is not a-minor under 21 years of age. 32 2. Sales to minors prohibited. A person may not sell, furnish, give away or offer to sell, furnish or give away a tobacco product to any person under 18 21 years of age. Tobacco 34 products may not be sold at retail to any person under 27 years of age unless the seller first verifies that person's age by 36 means of reliable photographic identification containing the 38 person's date of birth. 40 4. Wholesale sales. Tobacco products may be distributed at wholesale without a face-to-face exchange only in the normal 42 course of trade and under procedures approved by the Department of Administrative and Financial Services, Bureau of Taxation Revenue Services to ensure that tobacco products are not provided 44 to any person under 18 21 years of age. 46 Sec. 3. 22 MRSA §1555-B, sub-§5, as amended by PL 1997, c. 578, $\S1$, is further amended to read: 48 50 5. Possession and use of cigarettes, cigarette papers or tobacco products; use of false identification by persons under 21

years of age prohibited. Except as provided in paragraph A, a
person under 18 21 years of age may not purchase, possess or use cigarettes, cigarette paper or any tobacco product or offer false
identification in an attempt to purchase any tobacco products or to purchase, possess or use cigarettes, cigarette paper or any
other tobacco product.

- A. A person under 18 <u>21</u> years of age may transport or permit to be transported in a motor vehicle cigarettes,
 cigarette paper or tobacco products in the original, sealed package in which they were placed by the manufacturer if the
 transportation is in the scope of that person's employment.
- 14 Sec. 4. 22 MRSA §1555-B, sub-§§6 and 10, as enacted by PL 1997, c. 305, §5, are amended to read:
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6. Display of prohibition of sales to persons under 21 years of age. A dealer or distributor of tobacco products shall 18 post notice of this section prohibiting tobacco and cigarette 20 paper sales to persons under 18 21 years of age. Notices must be publicly and conspicuously displayed in the dealer's or distributor's place of business in letters at least 3/8 inches in 22 height. Signs required by this section may be provided at cost 24 by the department.

- 10. Affirmative defense. It is an affirmative defense to prosecution for a violation of subsection 1, 2 or 4 that the
 defendant sold, furnished, gave away or offered to sell, furnish or give away a tobacco product to a person under 18 21 years of
 age in reasonable reliance upon a fraudulent proof of age presented by the purchaser.
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SUMMARY

36 This bill raises from 18 years of age to 21 years of age the minimum age to purchase tobacco and tobacco products.
