An Act to Establish the Administrative Operating Budget for the Maine State Retirement System for the Fiscal Year Ending June 30, 2002.

(EMERGENCY)

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the 90-day period may not terminate until after the beginning of the next fiscal year; and

8 Whereas, certain obligations and expenses incident to the operation of the Maine State Retirement System will become due 10 and payable before the 90-day period may terminate; and

12 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of 14 Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and 16 safety; now, therefore,

18 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

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20 Sec. 1. Allocation of funds. Administrative operating expenses of the Maine State Retirement System for the fiscal year ending 22 June 30, 2002 must be paid from the retirement system's Expense Fund in accordance with the following schedule.

4	Sec. 4. Collective bargaining agreements approval. The allocations made in section 1 and the attributions made in

10	Sec. 5. Authorization to expend retirement system reserve administrative operating funds. Of the amount authorized to be
12	expended in section 1 for the administrative costs of the
14	retirement system, \$400,000 must be provided from the system's reserve administrative operating funds.
16	Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act takes effect July 1, 2001.
