Resolve, to Extend the Commission to Study Equity in the Distribution of Gas Tax Revenues Attributable to Snowmobiles, All-terrain Vehicles and Watercraft.

(EMERGENCY)

Reported by Representative DUNLAP for the Commission to Study Equity in the Distribution of Gas Tax Revenues Attributable to Snowmobiles, All-terrain Vehicles and Watercraft pursuant to Resolve 1999, chapter 131.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts and resolves of the 2 Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the Commission to Study Equity in the Distribution
 of Gas Tax Revenues Attributable to Snowmobiles, All-terrain
 Vehicles and Watercraft was created by Resolve 1999, chapter 131,
 with a final reporting date of December 6, 2000; and

10 Whereas, that commission was authorized to undertake research as necessary to collect and update information on the amount and type of fuel purchased for and consumed within this State by snowmobiles, all-terrain vehicles and motorboats and information on the amount and type of fuel purchased in this State for those vehicles and consumed outside the jurisdiction of this State; and

18 Whereas, that commission has authorized surveys to determine the amount of gasoline consumed by snowmobiles, all-terrain vehicles and watercraft; and

Whereas, the information obtained through those surveys is essential for the commission to fulfill its charge of determining the equitable distribution of gas tax revenues generated by snowmobiles, all-terrain vehicles and motorboats; and

Whereas, it is critical to the validity of the survey results that adequate time be allowed to develop the survey methodology and the survey questionnaire, to select the random sample of survey participants, to administer the survey and to analyze the survey results; and

Whereas, the successful completion of that work requires that the commission be extended until December 6, 2001, for the purpose of providing policy oversight of those survey efforts and to submit its findings and recommendations to the Second Regular Session of the 120th Legislature; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

Sec. 1. Commission established. Resolved: That the Commission to Study Equity in the Distribution of Gas Tax Revenues Attributable to Snowmobiles, All-terrain Vehicles and Watercraft, referred to in this resolve as the "commission," is established; and be it further

Sec. 2. Commission membership; appointed and ex officio members.
 Resolved: That the commission consists of 15 appointed members and up to 3 ad-hoc members as follows.

Legislative members reappointed. The legislative
 members who were appointed pursuant to Resolve 1999, chapter 131,
 who are members of the 120th Legislature are members of this
 commission.

10 Filling of legislative vacancies. 2. The President of the Senate shall appoint 3 members of the Senate to replace the 12 members of the Senate appointed pursuant to Resolve 1999, chapter 131, who are not members of the 120th Legislature. When making 14 those appointments, the President of the Senate shall give preference to members from the joint standing committees of the 16 Legislature having jurisdiction over inland fisheries and wildlife matters, transportation matters and taxation matters;

- 3. Ex officio members. The following persons are ex officio voting members:
- 22 A. The Commissioner of Conservation or the commissioner's designee;
- B. The Commissioner of Marine Resources or the commissioner's designee;
- 28 C. The Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife or the commissioner's designee;
 - D. The Commissioner of Transportation or the commissioner's designee; and
- E. The Director of the Bureau of Revenue Services within the Department of Administrative and Financial Services or
 the director's designee.

Ad hoc members. Persons who were appointed by the President of the Senate or the Speaker of the House pursuant to
 Resolve 1999, chapter 131, who are not elected members of the 120th Legislature may serve as nonvoting ad hoc members of the
 commission; and be it further

44 Sec. 3. **Appointments**; meetings. **Resolved:** That all appointments must be made no later than 30 days after the 46 effective date of this resolve. The appointing authorities shall notify the Executive Director of the Legislative Council once the 48 appointments have been made. The Executive Director of the Legislative Council shall notify the chairs when all appointments 50 have been made. The chairs of the commission shall call and

convene the first meeting of the commission any time after the 2 effective date of this resolve; and be it further

Sec. 4. Duties. Resolved: That the commission shall fulfill all the duties required by Resolve 1999, chapter 131 and shall:

1. Oversee contracts. Oversee the surveys of gasoline 8 consumption by all-terrain vehicles, snowmobiles and watercraft undertaken by the Margaret Chase Smith Center for Public Policy 10 at the University of Maine pursuant to a cooperative agreement between the university and the Department of Conservation, the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife, the Department of 12 Marine Resources and the Department of Transportation as provided 14 in a contract among those entities signed in November 2000. That oversight must include regular meetings during 2001 with the university and interested parties to assist in the development of 16 the surveys and to review and discuss the results of each survey; 18

2. Seek input from the public; Seek input. from organizations representing snowmobile, all-terrain vehicle and 20 watercraft users, including the Maine Snowmobile Association, groups representing all-terrain vehicle users and the Maine 22 Marine Trade Association; and from any other interested that input, 24 individuals or organizations. In seeking the commission shall, within its budgeted resources, hold its meetings in geographically diverse locations throughout the State; 26

3. Strategic boating plan. Review and report on any updates or supplemental information prepared by the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife, the Department of Conservation or the Department of Marine Resources pertaining to the strategic
 boating plan prepared by those agencies pursuant to Resolve 1999, chapter 131; and

4. Collect other data. Collect other data and make other
 36 recommendations the commission considers appropriate on the issue of off-road fuel consumption or on any other matter pertaining to
 38 off-road recreational vehicle use; and be it further

Sec. 5. Report. Resolved: 40 That the commission shall submit together its report, with any recommended implementing 42 legislation, to the Second Regular Session of the 120thLegislature no later than December 6, 2001. If the commission requires an extension of time to make its report, it may apply to 44 the Legislative Council, which may grant the extension; and be it 46 further

48 Sec. 6. Staff assistance. Resolved: That, upon approval of the Legislative Council, the Office of Policy and Legal

Analysis shall provide staffing assistance to the commission. The Office of Fiscal and Program Review and the Department of 2 Transportation, the Department of Marine Resources, the4 Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife, the Department of Conservation and the Department of Administrative and Financial Bureau of Revenue Services shall 6 Services, also provide assistance as requested by the commission; and be it further

Sec. 7. Compensation. Resolved: That the members of the 10 commission who are Legislators are entitled to receive the legislative per diem, as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, 12 Title 3, section 2, and reimbursement for travel and other necessary expenses related to their attendance at authorized meetings of the commission. Other members of the commission, 14 including ad hoc members, who are not compensated by their 16 employers or other entities that they represent are entitled to receive reimbursement for travel and other necessary expenses 18 related to their attendance at authorized meetings; and be it further

Sec. 8. Budget. Resolved: That the chairs of the commission, 22 with assistance from the commission staff, shall administer the The commission may not incur expenses commission's budget. exceeding its approved budget. Upon request from the commission, 24 the Executive Director of the Legislative Council shall promptly 26 provide the commission and its staff with a status report on the commission's budget, expenditures incurred and remaining 28 available funds; and be it further

30 Sec. 9. Appropriations carried over. Resolved: That funds appropriated to the commission by Resolve 1999, chapter 131 that 32 are unexpended are carried forward to fiscal year 2001-02 to be used for the purposes specified in that resolve and in this 34 resolve.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve takes effect when approved.

SUMMARY

42 This emergency resolve authorizes for an additional year, until December 6, 2001, the Commission to Study Equity in the 44 Distribution of Gas Tax Revenues Attributable to Snowmobiles, All-terrain Vehicles and Watercraft. That commission was 46 originally authorized during the Second Regular Session of the 119th Legislature pursuant to Resolve 1999, chapter 131.

This resolve reappoints the 5 ex officio members of the 50 commission appointed during the 119th Legislature and retains the legislative members appointed during the 119th Legislature who
are now members of the 120th Legislature. Members who were appointed as legislative members in 1999 but who are no longer
members of the Legislature are entitled to serve as ad hoc members of the commission during 2001.

No additional funding is requested in this resolve, although 8 the resolve does carry forward all unexpended balances appropriated in Resolve 1999, chapter 131, to be used by the 10 commission during 2001 to complete its responsibilities.
