•	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 17-A MRSA §505-A is enacted to read:
4 6	§505-A. Removal or destruction of street signs
8	1. A person may not intentionally destroy, mutilate, deface, injure or remove a street sign.
10	2. As used in this section, "street sign" means a marker
12	placed on a public way that denotes a physical address. 3. Removal or destruction of a street sign is a Class E
14	<u>crime.</u>

20	This bill prohibits the removal or destruction of street signs. The bill also makes the removal or destruction of street signs a Class E crime.
