Sec. 1. Commission established. Resolved: That the Commission to Study Abolishing the Maine Turnpike Authority, referred to in 2 this resolve as the "commission," is established; and be it further 4 Sec. 2. Commission membership. Resolved: That the commission 6 consists of the following 14 members: 8 Three members from the Senate who are members of the 1. Joint Standing Committee on Transportation, appointed by the 10 President of the Senate; 12 Ten members from the House of Representatives who are 2. 14 members of the Joint Standing Committee on Transportation, appointed by the Speaker of the House; and 16 The Commissioner of Transportation, the 3. or commissioner's designee; and be it further 18 Sec. 3. Chairs. Resolved: That the first named Senate member 20 is the Senate chair of the commission and the first named House 22 member is the House chair of the commission; and be it further meetings. **Resolved:** Sec. 4. Appointments; That 24 the appointments must be made no later than 30 days after the 26 effective date of this resolve. The appointing authorities shall notify the Executive Director of the Legislative Council once the The Executive Director of the 28 appointments have been made. Legislative Council shall notify the chairs when all appointments 30 have been made. The chairs of the commission shall call and convene the first meeting of the commission within 30 days of being notified that all appointments have been made; and be it 32 further 34 Sec. 5. Duties. Resolved: That the commission shall undertake a comprehensive effort to study abolishing the Maine Turnpike 36 Authority. This comprehensive study must include: 38 1. Sec. 6. Report. Resolved: That the commission shall submit 8 report, together its with any recommended implementing legislation, to the 120th Legislature no later than November 7, 10 2002. If the commission requires an extension of time to make its report, it may apply to the Legislative Council, which may grant the extension; and be it further 12

14 Sec. 7. Staff assistance. Resolved: That, upon approval of the Legislative Council, the Office of Policy and Legal Analysis 16 shall provide staffing assistance to the commission. The Office of Fiscal and Program Review, the Department of Transportation 18 and the Maine Turnpike Authority shall also provide assistance as requested by the commission; and be it further 20

Sec. 8. Compensation. Resolved: That the legislative members of the commission are entitled to receive the legislative per diem, as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 3, section 2, and reimbursement for travel and other necessary expenses related to their attendance at authorized meetings of the commission; and be it further

Sec. 9. Budget. Resolved: That the chairs of the commission, 28 with assistance from the commission staff, shall administer the commission's budget. The commission may not incur expenses 30 exceeding its approved budget. Upon request from the commission, the Executive Director of the Legislative Council shall promptly 32 provide the commission and its staff with a status report on the 34 commission's budget, expenditures incurred and remaining available funds.

## SUMMARY

40 This resolve creates the Commission to Study Abolishing the Maine Turnpike Authority. Membership of the commission includes 42 the 3 members of the Senate and 10 members of the House of Representatives who are members of the Joint Standing Committee 44 on Transportation and the Commissioner of Transportation or the commissioner's designee. Commission duties include undertaking a 46 comprehensive study to abolish the Maine Turnpike Authority. 48 toll equity, an analysis of the availability of federal highway funds if the Maine Turnpike Authority is abolished, an analysis of estimates in cost savings or losses if the Maine Turnpike Authority is abolished, an analysis of the implications of abolishing the Maine Turnpike Authority and a list of options that may provide a course of action to reallocate the functions, duties and obligations of the Maine Turnpike Authority to another agency. The commission shall submit a report to 120th Legislature no later than November 7, 2002.
