and for psychiatric and medical fees. The department may also experience future savings from reductions in the actual length of stay for certain prisoners. The amounts can not be determined at this time.

The Department of Mental Health, Mental Retardation and Substance Abuse Services may also require additional General Fund appropriations to support the costs of care and treatment of persons committed to the department.'

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12 SUMMARY

This amendment is the minority report of the Joint Standing Committee on Criminal Justice and adds a fiscal note to the bill.

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
