SENATE AMENDMENT "*D*" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P.  
1746, L.D. 2220, Bill, "An Act to Make Supplemental  
Appropriations and Allocations for the Expenditures of State  
Government and to Change Certain Provisions of the Law Necessary  
to the Proper Operations of State Government for the Fiscal Year  
Ending June 30, 2003"

Amend the amendment by striking out all of the emergency  
preamble.

Further amend the amendment in Part A in section 1 on page 9  
in the first occurrence of that part relating to "**Nursing  
Facilities**" in the 3rd line (page 9, line 28 in amendment) by  
striking out the following: "repeal" and inserting in its place  
the following: 'one-year suspension'

Further amend the amendment in Part A in section 1 on page 9  
in the 2nd occurrence of that part relating to "**Nursing  
Facilities**" in the 3rd line (page 9, line 45 in amendment) by  
striking out the following: "repeal" and inserting in its place  
the following: 'delay'

Further amend the amendment by striking out all of the  
emergency clause.

FISCAL NOTE

This amendment will have no effect on the General Fund  
budget in fiscal year 2002-03. This amendment makes corrections  
to reflect motions made as part of the acceptance of the majority  
report.

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
**SUMMARY**

This amendment removes the emergency status of the bill and makes corrections to the amendment to reflect the motions made to accept the majority report.

This amendment clarifies that Part GG does not repeal but suspends operation of the law that allows nonprofit nursing facilities to be reimbursed for a return on net assets and that Part HH does not repeal but delays operation of the law that lowered the minimum occupancy percentages for nursing facilities.
