corporations with their assets upon their dissolution to be delivered to the Seeretary Treasurer of State to be held in custody for the municipalities of the State. An educational advisory organization may receive federal grants or contributions for their activities with respect to the solution of local problems.

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A municipality may provide health or remedial nonpublic school pupils as authorized by this section only if those services are available to pupils attending the public school serving the municipality.

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Health and remedial services and instructional materials and equipment provided for the benefit of nonpublic school pupils under this section and the admission of pupils to the nonpublic schools must be provided without distinction as to race, creed, color, the national origin of the pupils or of their teachers. No instructional materials or instructional equipment may be loaned to pupils in nonpublic schools or their parents unless similar instructional material or instructional equipment is available for pupils in a public school served by a municipality.'

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SUMMARY

This amendment replaces the Secretary of State with the Treasurer of State as the entity designated to hold the assets upon dissolution of the Maine County Commissioners' Association and the Maine Sheriffs' Association. It also replaces the Secretary of State with the Treasurer of State as the entity designated to hold the assets for the Maine Municipal Association, the Maine School Management Association and the Maine School Boards Association upon their dissolution in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 30-A, sections 5722 and 5724.

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
