#### **SUMMARY**

This amendment replaces the bill and authorizes the Chief of
the State Police to issue a license to conduct high-stakes beano
on non-Indian Territory to a federally recognized Maine tribe
that is currently eligible but not operating high-stakes beano.
The location of the games must be within 45 miles of the tribe's
land and at least 75 miles from the land of any other tribe
conducting high-stakes beano. This amendment is not intended to
allow the operation of games on land owned by the Passamaquoddy
tribe in Albany Township.

This bill may increase civil violations filed in the court system for certain beano violations and decrease the number of civil violations for operating beano without a license. No net judicial change.

#### Fiscal Detail and Notes

Authorizing the Department of Public Safety to issue a certain license for the operation of high stakes beano games will result in an annual revenue increase of \$50,000 to the General Fund beginning in fiscal year 2004-05.
