COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 486, L.D. 656, Bill, "An Act to Allow Beverage Sales from Mobile Service Bars on Golf Courses"

Amend the bill in section 4 in that part designated "~~§1075-A.~~" in subsection 2 in paragraph I in the last line (page 2, line 31 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "and"

Further amend the bill in section 4 in that part designated "~~§1075-A.~~" in subsection 2 by striking out all of paragraph J (page 2, lines 33 to 35 in L.D.) and inserting in its place the following:

'J. The operator of a mobile service bar is at least 21 years of age and has successfully completed an alcohol server education course; and

K. The operator of a mobile service bar has the ability and necessary tools to immediately contact a golf course employee working at the part of the golf course licensed as an on-premises establishment for assistance in enforcing the provisions of this section.'

Further amend the bill in section 4 in that part designated "~~§1075-A.~~" by inserting after subsection 4 the following:

'5. Transportation of open containers prohibited. A patron of a golf course licensed under this section who operates a golf cart is prohibited from transporting an open container of liquor across a public way as defined by Title 29-A, section 2112-A, subsection 1, paragraph D.'

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT

2 Further amend the bill in section 4 in that part designated
4 "§1075-A." by renumbering the subsections to read consecutively.

6 **SUMMARY**

8 This amendment specifies that an operator of a mobile
10 service bar must be at least 21 years of age and must have the
12 ability to immediately contact the golf course's on-premises
14 establishment for assistance when needed. The amendment also
specifies that a patron of the golf course who operates a golf
cart may not transport open containers of liquor across a public
way.
