SUMMARY

This bill requires the installation of amalgam separator 40 systems in dental offices that add, remove or modify dental amalgam. These systems must comply with the standards of the 42 International Organization for Standardization, ISO 11143:1999. Dentists must notify the Department of Environmental Protection 44 of their installations and must also notify the director or chief engineer of a publicly owned treatment works if their wastewater 46 is discharged into a publicly owned treatment works. Dentists and not comply with these requirements until December 31, 2004.

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
