	Sec. 1. 29-A MRSA §2413, sub-§6 is enacted to read:

	6. Multiple citations. If a person receives 2 citations
6	for an offense under this section within a period of one year,
	the person's driver's license is immediately suspended upon
8	issuance of the 2nd citation. The law enforcement officer
	issuing the 2nd citation shall take possession of the driver's
10	license of the person. The driver's license must be kept in the
	possession of the State until final disposition by the court.

16	This bill provides that the driver's license of a person
	cited twice for driving to endanger within a year will be
18	immediately suspended pending final disposition by the court.
