An Act To Expand the State Fire Marshal's Responsibilities and To Clarify That the Commissioner of Public Safety Will Follow the Maine Administrative Procedure Act when Adopting Certain Rules

	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2 4	Sec. 1. 25 MRSA §2396, sub-§3, as repealed and replaced by PL 1973, c. 632, §6, is amended to read:
б	<b>3. Explosives.</b> The storage, sale and use of combustibles, flammables, incendiary devices and explosives;
8	Sec. 2. 25 MRSA §2452, first ¶, as amended by PL 1997, c. 728,
10	$\S25$ , is further amended to read:
12	The Commissioner of Public Safety shall adopt and may amend, after notice and -public-hearing in accordance with the Maine
14	Administrative Procedure Act, reasonable rules governing the safety to life from fire in <u>or around</u> all buildings or other
16	structures <u>and outdoor gatherings</u> within the commissioner's jurisdiction. These rules do not apply to nursing homes having 3
18	or fewer patients. Automatic sprinkler systems may not be required in existing noncommercial places of assembly.
20	Noncommercial places of assembly include those facilities used for such purposes as deliberation, worship, entertainment,
22	amusement or awaiting transportation that have a capacity of 100 to 300 persons.
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26	SUMMARY
28	This bill expands the responsibility of the State Fire Marshal to include protection of the public in the area of
30	incendiary devices and makes it clear that the Commissioner of Public Safety must follow the Maine Administrative Procedure Act
32	when making rules involving life safety and property protection.

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
