30	No later than November 1, 2005, the Secretary of State shall					
	issue Wabanaki registration plates to members of federally					
32	recognized tribes in the State pursuant to this section.					
34	1. Wabanaki registration plates. The Secretary of State,					
	upon receiving an application and evidence of payment of the					
36	registration fee required by section 501, the excise tax required					
	by Title 36, section 1482, a statement signed by a tribal					
38	official from a federally recognized tribe within the Wabanaki					
4.0	Confederacy proving the applicant's membership in the tribe,					
40	shall issue a registration certificate and a set of Wabanaki registration plates to be used in lieu of regular registration					
42	plates. These plates must bear identification numbers and letters					
	and the word "Wabanaki."					
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	2. Reimbursement for production and issuance costs for					
46	plates. The Wabanaki Confederacy shall pay all costs associated					

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with the initial production and issuance of the plates and shall provide payment to the Secretary of State for the costs to

replenish the Wabanaki plate inventory.

	3. Design. The Secretary of State, in consultation with
2	the Wabanaki Confederacy, shall determine a design for the
	Wabanaki registration plates. The joint standing committee of the
4	Legislature having jurisdiction over transportation matters shall
	review the final design prior to manufacture of the plates. Upon
6	request, the Secretary of State shall issue Wabanaki plates that
	are also vanity plates. Wabanaki plates are issued in accordance
8	with the provisions of this section and section 453.
10	4. Renewal fee. The renewal fee for the Wabanaki plate is
	the regular motor vehicle registration fee reguired by section
12	<u>501.</u>
14	5. Duplicate plates. The Secretary of State shall issue
	Wabanaki plates in a 3-number and 3-letter combination sequence.
16	Vanity plates may not duplicate vanity plates issued in another
	class of plate.

	6. Weight limit. A Wabanaki plate may be issued for a
20	motor vehicle that does not exceed 9,000 pounds. A motor vehicle
	that exceeds 6,000 pounds is subject to the fees in section 504.

#### Fiscal Detail and Notes

The issuance of special registration plates to members of federally recognized tribes will require a one-time additional Highway Fund allocation of \$9,586 in fiscal year 2005-06 to the Bureau of Motor Vehicles within the Department of the Secretary of State. This additional cost will be reimbursed by the federally recognized tribes, thereby resulting in a one-time Highway Fund revenue increase of \$9,586 in fiscal year 2005-06.
