SUMMARY

Under current law, disability retirement benefits under the 22 Maine State Retirement System are discontinued after a certain number of years if the person receiving the benefit is able to 24 engage in "substantially gainful activity." The current determination of ability to engage in substantially gainful 26 activity is based on the person's ability to perform work that would result in earnings of a certain amount, regardless of 28 whether the person is actually performing such work.

30 The bill bases the determination of "ability to engage in substantially gainful activity" on the actual performance of work 32 resulting in that level of earnings. The amendment changes the language to preserve the original method of making the 34 determination, i.e., basing it on the ability to perform work, not the actual performance.

The amendment clarifies the language in the bill that changes the amount of earnings that indicate the ability to engage in substantially gainful activity. Under the bill, as amended, that amount is \$20,000 or 80% of the person's average final compensation at retirement, whichever is greater, adjusted for increases in the cost-of-living.

Finally, the amendment removes the retroactivity provision.

Fiscal Detail and Notes

Continuing the payment of disability benefits to recipients who, under current law, would have their disability retirement benefit discontinued will result in increased costs to the retirement plan. The impact can not be determined at this time. Although this legislation does not directly create an unfunded liability, it does result in the existing unfunded liability being paid down at a slower rate than what would have occurred without this provision. These costs will ultimately be reflected in the ongoing unfunded liability component of the employer retirement rate, resulting in increased employer contributions to the Maine State Retirement System for state employees and teachers.
