**Emergency preamble. Whereas,** Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, this legislation needs to take effect before the expiration of the 90-day period in order to prevent changes to the law that are scheduled to take effect before the expiration of the 90-day period; and

10 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of
 12 Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and
 14 safety; now, therefore,

## 16 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

18 Sec. 1. 25 MRSA §3701, sub-§6, as enacted by PL 2001, c. 582, §1, is amended to read:

6. Solicitation agent. "Solicitation agent" means a person
or entity that receives payment for or retains any portion of the proceeds from soliciting. "Solicitation agent" includes, but is
not limited to, a person or entity that receives or retains reimbursement for expenses related to soliciting.

Sec. 2. 25 MRSA §3702-A, as amended by PL 2001, c. 582, §2, 30 is further amended to read:

32 §3702-A. Solicitation unlawful

A law enforcement agency, law enforcement association, law 34 enforcement officer or solicitation agent may not solicit property from the general public when the property or any part of 36 that property in any way tangibly benefits, is intended to tangibly benefit or is represented to be for the tangible benefit 38 of any law enforcement officer, law enforcement agency or law chapter Any violation this enforcement association. of 40 constitutes a violation of the Maine Unfair Trade Practices Act. 42 This-section-is-repealed-February-1,-2004.

- 44 Sec. 3. 25 MRSA §3702-B, as enacted by PL 2001, c. 582, §3, is repealed.
- **Emergency clause.** In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act takes effect when approved.

	This bill removes language that repeals the current law
6	regarding unlawful solicitation to benefit law enforcement agencies. This bill allows a person to continue to solicit as
8	long as property solicited in no way tangibly benefits the solicitor.
