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10 **SUMMARY**

This amendment is the minority report of the Joint Standing Committee on Education and Cultural Affairs. The amendment strikes and replaces the bill with an amendment that clarifies that, beginning in fiscal year 2005-06, the annual reports submitted by school superintendents to the Commissioner of Education must be filed in the format and within the time periods specified by the commissioner. The amendment further provides that the annual report filed by superintendents must include a detailed report of all school administrative unit expenses for legal, consulting and other professional services in the format required by the Commissioner of Education to implement the Maine Education Data Management System in fiscal year 2005-06. amendment also adds an effective date of July 1, 2005.

Because school administrative units are already required to change the way annual reports are formatted by fiscal year 2005-06 in order to be able to submit them through the new Maine Education Data Management System, there will be no additional costs to the local school units to provide the required detail of expenses for legal services, consulting and other professional services. Since school administrative units are required by statute to file reports in the format and the time periods specified by the Commissioner of Education, there is no mandate.
