2	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 20-A MRSA §1055, sub-§9, as amended by PL 1983, c.
4	859, Pt. A, \S 4 and 25, is further amended to read:
6	9. Report to the commissioner. The superintendent shall annually report, under oath, to the commissioner before a date
8	established by the commissioner, concerning the operation of the school unit. The report shall must contain:
10	A. The amount appropriated and expended on elementary and
12	secondary education in the preceding fiscal year;
14	B. The number of weeks schools were open;
16	C. The number of students registered;
18	D. The average attendance;
20	E. The amount received for tuition; and
22	E-1. An itemized report of all fees and expenses incurred or paid for legal, consulting and other professional
24	services; and
26	F. Other information required by rule adopted by the commissioner to demonstrate compliance with the requirements
28	of this Title.
30	SUMMARY
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34	This bill requires local school units to provide an itemized report of all expenditures for legal, consulting and other professional services.

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
