An Act To Amend the Law Governing the Storage of Spirits

## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows: 2 Sec. 1. 28-A MRSA §453-C, sub-§3 is enacted to read: 4 3. Off-site storage facility license. A licensed reselling 6 agent may obtain a license to maintain an off-site facility for the storage of spirits as provided in this subsection. 8 A. The off-site storage facility may not be used for retail 10 sales. The off-site storage facility may be used only for reselling activities related to delivery to an on-premise 12 licensee. 14 B. The off-site storage facility must be equipped with a security system providing 24-hour response. 16 C. A licensed reselling agent may have only one off-site 18 storage facility. 20 D. The fee for an off-site storage facility license is \$100 annually. 22 24 **SUMMARY** 26 This bill establishes an off-site storage facility license to allow an agency liquor store with a federal and state license permitting the agency liquor store to sell spirits to an 28 on-premise licensee licensed for on-premises consumption to 30 maintain a facility for the storage of spirits. The facility may be used only for the storage of spirits and other reselling-related activities. Such an agency liquor store may 32 maintain only one off-site storage facility.
